Hi everyone. We are still in the very early stages of all of this and there are plenty of rough edges that will need smoothing. Tomorrow, at 1:00pm I will have a review session regarding the Waste topic. Have your study guide and/or notes available and be ready to drive the conversation with your questions. I will probably also do an abridged lesson on the laws we learned on Thursday and Friday of last week for those who were out. If need be, I'll also come on at 9:00pm for those who may have had conflicts with the 1:00pm time. I'll make a final decision on time tomorrow based on feedback from you guys.

Friday I will open the AP Classroom assignment on Waste. This will replace the test we were going to have on Tuesday. Let's put this flat out on the table right now... It is already a difficult task to make sure we are individually accountable for our own work under normal circumstances, but the way we have to proceed online creates even more of a problem maintaining the integrity of assessments meant to serve as a check on your own individual knowledge and understanding.

I'm not really sure how grades are going to work, or even if it is an ultimate concern, but at least we will have checkpoints, completed assignments, and assessments that can be used to calculate a grade if necessary. At this point, I just want to finish what we have started together. I am trying to modify what I do to keep you guys on track and prepared for whatever is to come, as well as trying to help my ELL Earth Science students progress forward (with both science and English!). Our next meeting will be next Monday (W-day) during our normal (but slightly modified) time slots. Period 1-2 we will meet at 8:00-9:00am and Period 5-6 at 11:00am-12pm.
